THE SMALL STEPS MISSION

To provide an exemplary early childhood program to instill and foster the social, emotional, physical, intellectual, and spiritual growth of economically at-risk children and their families.

EARS

Ears are for listening! The first few years of a child's life are pivotal for learning social-emotional skills like listening to teacher instructions and the feelings of peers. Active listening also exposes students to a wide range of vocabulary and language constructions that help develop their literacy skills.

HANDS

Hands are for holding! Small Steps is a relationship-based program. We foster strong student-teacher relationships to create a safe and nurturing environment for our students to thrive both emotionally and academically.



BRAIN

Brains are for learning! Language development is at the core of Small Steps' program. Educational activities focus on expanding vocabulary and building literacy skills. Teachers also integrate science and math concepts to ensure students are receiving a well-rounded academic foundation for elementary school.

HEART

Hearts are for loving! Students learn how to process and express their emotions in productive ways, which helps them build positive relationships with those around them. They also learn about the love of God, and that His love will be with them always.

FEET

Feet are for running! Small Steps provides students with a safe outdoor environment for kids to play and expend their energy, supporting their physical growth.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS















Our families complete at least ten tuition hours annually for their children to attend Small Steps. This requirement supports parents as active participants in our program and their child's education. Parents complete these hours through parent education classes or volunteerism.

This year, we hosted a collaborative workshop revolving around play-based learning and how it supports child development. Parents attended with their children, learning age-appropriate, hands-on ways to play with their children at home. Other classes on topics like parenting strategies, developmental milestones, and financial literacy took place online throughout the school year.









In the 2020–2021 school year, Small Steps opened a new campus in the Gulfton/Sharpstown neighborhood of Houston. When opening the Gulfton campus, children ages four and younger accounted for 13% of the area's population, but many families lacked access to high-quality early childhood education programs. Small Steps saw the gap and sought to be a resource for this culturally diverse community.

When the Gulfton campus opened, 45 students were welcomed into three classrooms that provided a safe educational environment for them to learn and grow. The 2025–2026 school year will see **75** students walk through the doors on Bellaire Boulevard to begin the campus's fifth school year!

Our generous donors made this expansion possible, as well as our invaluable partnership with St. Luke's United Methodist Church Gethsemane. Our partnership with St. Luke's helped us build strong relationships within the community quickly, and going into our fifth school year, we have a waitlist of more than 40 students.



Success Story



Carolina* arrived at Small Steps never having been to school before. She struggled with establishing relationships and low academic performance. When the year started, Carolina frequently stated she did not want to come to school. She was unable to identify the difference between colors, shapes, and numbers and recalling information was challenging. To support Carolina's socialemotional needs, she began play therapy, and as a result, her confidence and performance truly began to soar. Her self-talk became more positive, and she could frequently be heard stating things like, "I love school. You teach me love, Ms. P!" Her progress was powered by a multi-disciplinary team where teachers, parents, and therapists worked together towards her goals. By fostering Carolina's socialemotional growth, she was equipped with the tools to thrive academically and experienced a complete turnaround by the end of the year.


